DELETE PARAGRAPH

1. Place cursor anywhere in paragraph and enter

(ESC) (H) [define paragraph command]

2. Followed by

(CTRL) — (W) [wipe region command]

DELETE REGION

1. At front of region insert

(ESC) (SPACE) (BAR) echo line responds "Mark Set"

2. Move cursor to end of region to be deleted and enter

(CTRL) — (W) [wipe region command]

INSERT

Open Insert



Close Insert



Insert File



Adjust Paragraph (cleans up text after deletions and insertions)

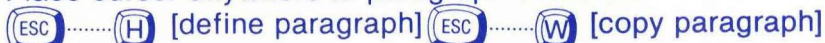


COPY AND MOVE

(Text can be moved within and between buffers.)

COPY PARAGRAPH

1. Place cursor anywhere in paragraph and enter



2. Position cursor where text is to be inserted and enter



COPY REGION

1. At front of region to be copied insert



2. Move cursor to end of region to be copied and enter



3. Position cursor where text is to be moved and enter



GATHERING AND MOVING TEXT

After the + sign appears in Step 2 above enter



Then move cursor to the next region to be gathered for copying and restart at Step 1 above.
