

The Digital Group system has a very convenient and easy way to send perfect Morse code from the Computer Keyboard. A cassette tape called the "Ham-1" is available which has CW & RTTY programs on it.

The "CW Send" routine has three pre-set speeds; 5, 13, and 20 words per minute. It is also possible to increment or decrement the speed up or down from the pre-set speed. In addition, there are 8 - 100 character memories that can be called up in which info on the station equipment, name & QTH or what-ever can be stored.

The interface hardware is very simple - resistor, NPN transistor, protective diode, and a small 12 volt D.C. relay.



## 8080 Machine Language Programs

Memory space can be saved and program execution can be sped up by using the following trick when the program involves a series of calls to subroutines. Many programs have sections in them that will be of the following form-

> CALL XXXX CALL YYYY CALL ZZZZ RET

A program section having the following form can usually be substituted.


CALL XXXX CALL YYYY JMP ZZZZ

The second form is shorter since the RET instruction is not needed. The second form will also execute much faster since we do not have to put the return adr on the stack in the CALL ZZZZ instruction and we also do not have to pick the return adr off the stack for the extra RET instruction.

Another use for the stack is for exchanging regester contents. As an example consider a program for printing the contents of all the 8080 registers. A subroutine could be written to print the contents of The H register pair. The mainline program could move each reg to H,L and call the subroutine as follows.

> PUSH H PUSH PSW POP H CALL H,L PRINT PUSH B POP H CALL H,L PRINT POP H CALL H,L PRINT POP H CALL H,L PRINT
